2025 Advocacy Agenda

- Lead efforts to advance parity and modernize scope of practice
 - Ensure podiatrists are recognized and permitted to practice to the full extent of their education and training in all laws and regulations.
- Ensure fair reimbursement & financial security
 - Ensure fair and sustainable payment rates for services provided by podiatrists.
- Ensure continuity for a strong podiatry workforce
 - Lead efforts for policy and funding for educational programs to recruit, retain, and grow the podiatric workforce.
- Public promotion of podiatry
 - Educate policymakers and the public on the role of podiatrists in preventing and managing chronic conditions.

Advocacy in Action: Lead efforts to advance parity and modernize scope of practice

 Optum's misclassification of
 Doctors of Podiatric
 Medicine.
- Congress passed a DEA MATE Act Fix to ensure podiatry organizations are accepted providers of required opioid education!



Advocacy in Action: Ensure fair reimbursement & financial security

Signed on to joint letters to Congress with 90+ health-care societies.

Result: Congress passed The One Big Beautiful Bill in early July, securing a 2.5-percent Medicare physician payment increase for 2026.

APMA continues to advocate for a permanent solution.

Advocacy in Action: Ensure fair reimbursement & financial security

- Fighting to preserve access to podiatrists in Medicaid following the passage of The One Big Beautiful Bill Act and cuts to Medicaid.
- Endorsed the Seniors' Timely Access to Care Act (HR 3514/S 1816). This bill streamlines the Medicare Advantage plans' time-consuming prior authorization processes.
- Engaged with Aetna regarding downcoding, orthotics and prior authorization.
- Partnered with national orthopedic societies to oppose Cigna's new 50 Modifier policy.
- Opposed Cigna's Downcoding policy.
- SALT Deduction Preserved in The One Big Beautiful Bill Act

Advocacy in Action: Ensure continuity for a strong podiatry workforce

- Opposed student loan proposals in The One Big Beautiful Bill
 - Partnered with AACPM and APMSA on a grassroots campaign opposing harmful student loan proposals
 - Signed joint letters with over 100 health-care and medical organizations urging Congress to protect student loan access
 - Proposed alternative policies to key Senate leaders with AACPM and the Association of American Medical Colleges
- Promoting an eAdvocacy campaign for Resident Education Deferred Interest Act (REDI) Act
- Continue to collaborate with other health professionals to address the student debt crisis

Advocacy in Action: Public promotion of podiatry

- APMA staff is reintroducing APMA to Congressional offices and rebuilding champions. Staff have conducted over 30 bipartisan meetings on the Hill since July
- Meeting with Members of Congress on key committees.
- Building relationships with Members of Congress who have podiatric schools in their districts.
- Building relationships with the GOP Doc Caucus and Dem Doc Caucus members
- On Nov. 6, during Diabetic Awareness Month, APMA is planning a Congressional briefing on the role of podiatry and preserving limbs. APMA is also planning a mini-Hill Day for BOT and ELP members


