<u>SJR 1</u> **HEALTH CARE** (<u>Grendell</u>) Proposing to enact Section 21 of Article I of the Constitution of the State of Ohio to preserve the freedom of Ohioans to choose their health care and health care coverage.

SB 25 MEDICAID PAYMENTS (<u>Tavares</u>) To specify that the Ohio prompt payment law applies to payment of claims by Medicaid managed care organizations.

<u>SB 94</u> **HUMAN CLONING** (<u>Jordan</u>) To prohibit human cloning, the creation, transportation, or receipt of a human-animal hybrid, the transfer of a nonhuman embryo into a human womb, and the transfer of a human embryo into a nonhuman womb.

<u>SB 111</u> HEALTH CARE ASSAULT (<u>Oelslager</u>) To increase the penalty for assault to a felony of the fourth degree when the victim is a health care professional, health care worker, or security officer of a hospital who is engaged in the performance of the individual's duties.

<u>SB 129</u> MEDICAL IMMUNITY (<u>Bacon</u>) To grant qualified civil immunity to a physician, physician assistant, dentist or optometrist who provides emergency medical, dental or optometric services, first-aid treatment or other emergency professional care in compliance with the federal Emergency Medical Treatment and Active Labor Act or as a result of a disaster and to a certified nurse-midwife, certified nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist or registered nurse who

provides emergency services, first-aid treatment or other emergency professional care as a result of a disaster and to provide that these provisions to not apply to wrongful death actions.

<u>SB 136</u> HEALTH CARE SERVICES (<u>Oelslager</u>, <u>Cafaro</u>) To make changes to the law regarding preapproval of and payment for health care services.

<u>SB 141</u> MEDICAL SERVICES (<u>Gillmor</u>) To authorize a licensed physician from another state to provide medical services to an out-of-state athletic team and accompanying individuals when the team is participating in a sporting event in Ohio.

HB 13 MEDICAID PREMIUM ASSISTANCE (Sears) To require the Director of Job and Family Services to seek federal approval to create a premium assistance component of the Medicaid program.

<u>HB 62</u> NURSE ASSAULT (<u>Gonzales</u>) To increase the penalty for assault when the victim is a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse engaged in the performance of official duties whom the offender knows or has reasonable cause to believe is a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse.

HB 71 PRESCRIPTION DRUGS (<u>Luckie</u>) To create the Ohio Official Prescription Program and to require prescribers and pharmacists to obtain information from the Ohio Automated Rx Reporting System.
